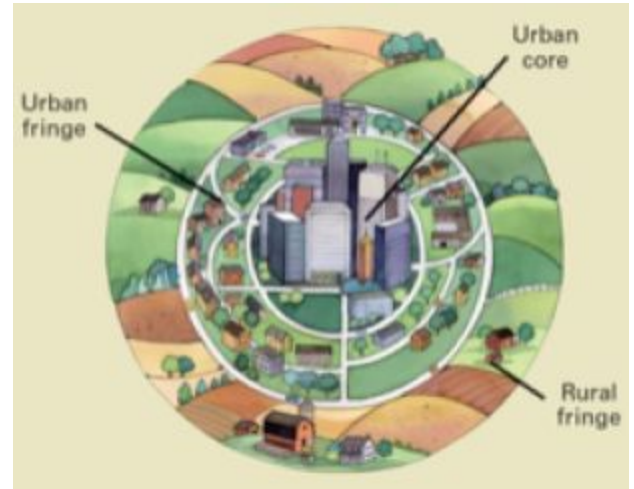


1. Meet with your assigned interest group.
